- 6. Focusing on your _shortcomings_
- 7. Refusing to _enjoy_ God's blessings
- 8. Feeling _guilty_ all the time
- 9. Equating _gloominess_ with holiness
- 10. Letting people _walk_ over you

The three questions of the Crucified Life . . .

Do I _publicly _ identify _ with Christ?
